ADDITIONAL CARES ACT FUNDING RELEASED

STATE AUTHORIZES ANOTHER DISTRIBUTION OF CARES ACT FUNDING

The State has released, via the Ohio Controlling Board, another \$175 million in federal CARES Act funding to local governments.

The process to access the funds is the same as the initial distribution made through HB 481. If a local government has already passed a resolution requesting funds as required by HB 481, no additional action is needed. The formula for distribution, timeline, and rules for funding are the same as under HB 481.

As a reminder, the initial distribution under HB 481 totaled \$350 million. This second round is \$175 million. Therefore, local governments can expect to receive - through the second round of funding - approximately 50 percent of what they were allocated under HB 481.
